Memberships:

All competitors must have current MHC membership. Out of province competitors are eligible to compete, however, they must provide proof of

membership with their home Provincial/Territorial Sport Organization (PTSO). All trainers/coaches must also carry an MHC membership (or other PTSO).

Entries:

No hay or bedding will be provided.

Trainer/Tack Stall Splits must be done by Noon Saturday.

The Show Office will open to pay fees, signing waivers, etc. Friday at 9:30AM

Show office will stay open for approx. 1/2 hour after the last class, Friday and Saturday, please make sure you get your class adds/scratches in for the next day. \$10.00 fee will apply for same day add/scratches

Health Requirements:

Proof of Vaccination: You must provide proof of vaccination for all your horses on the grounds, showing or not.

A letter from a veterinarian or invoice from a veterinarian is satisfactory for proof of horse immunization Required Vaccines are Influenza and EHV-1 & 4 (Rhino) – administered 21 days prior to arrival at the show and no more than 6 months. (180 Days)

Participation:

Numbers are to be worn in such a way that they are easily visible to the judge.

Participants are encouraged to wear show attire, but may dress casually, however, regulation hard hats, and proper footwear must be worn, and professional, safe, conservative, attire is requested.

Tack and Equipment must be legal for the division you are participating in per EC Rules.

For safety, flat classes with large numbers may be split at the discretion of the managers.

****Must Show over fences to go into the Under Saddle Class****

People wishing to ride in the warm-up ring, have precedence over those wishing to lunge.

There will be NO lunging while people are mounted in the warm-up ring. Protests should be directed in writing to the managers.

In the event of a cancellation of an entry a vet's certificate must be presented. Administration and stall fees will not be refunded.

In the event of a fall, Provincial Ex will adhere to Sport Manitoba "Return to Play" guidelines when assessing a rider's ability to continue in the competition following a possible head injury. The guidelines and descriptions of concussive head injuries can be found at www.parachutecanada.org. Onsite medics will make the decision as to whether a rider will be allowed to continue in the competition following a suspected concussive head injury and will be made solely to prevent any further injury.

For ground pole, cross rail and 2'0 classes after a horse/pony's first refusal, a coach/ground person may enter the ring and assist the rider to complete their round.

Classes under and including 3ft in height will be allowed 3 refusals. All other classes will be run under EC rules of 2 refusals.

Riders are allowed one courtesy fence upon elimination.

Horses may move down one height from their first class entered, with unrestricted upwards movement allowed.

Stallions: Well-mannered stallions may ONLY be shown/handled by junior A and adult competitors.

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself, to refuse, limit, accept conditionally, or to cancel awarded prizes; to change any course, or to change rings or officials, to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors and to intercept all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Posted notice will be given to all exhibitors in the event of a change in the program.

The abuse or inhumane treatment of a horse will not be tolerated. This may include excessive riding at the detriment of horse/pony's well-being. Any unsportsmanlike conduct or use of abusive language by any person towards any other person will not be tolerated. Contemptuous comments and any interference towards officials will not be tolerated. Any of the above actions WILL result in removal from show, and possible exclusion from exhibiting for one or more years.

The judge will not be approached; any issues must be addressed through the show committee.

It is the rider's/owner's/trainer's responsibility to be aware of rules and rule changes.

Friday WARM-UPS:

A warmup fee of \$35.00. This will allow you to do open hunter ring warmups and/or sign up for individual jumper ring rounds.

Hunter warm-ups will begin at 10 am and take place over a preset course. Open warmups will be run in the hunter ring and the maximum number of horses in the ring at one time shall not exceed 6.

Jumper warm-ups will begin at 10 am and take place over a preset course. Each rider - horse combination will sign up for individual rounds at their appropriate height. After the first refusal the coach may enter to assist their student for a maximum time of 5 minutes. Refer to the schedule when signing up for heights.

ARRIVALS:

Paperwork must be presented to the entry secretary upon arrival.

Horses will be allowed on the grounds starting at 12pm on Thursday June 4th

The competition rules are in effect upon the arrival of the first horse on the competition grounds.

All entries will have stalls assigned prior to arrival.

The show office will open at approximately 9:30 AM on Friday

LIABILITY:

It is a condition of entry that management will not be responsible for the loss of tack and/or equipment and/or injury to the horse and/or rider.

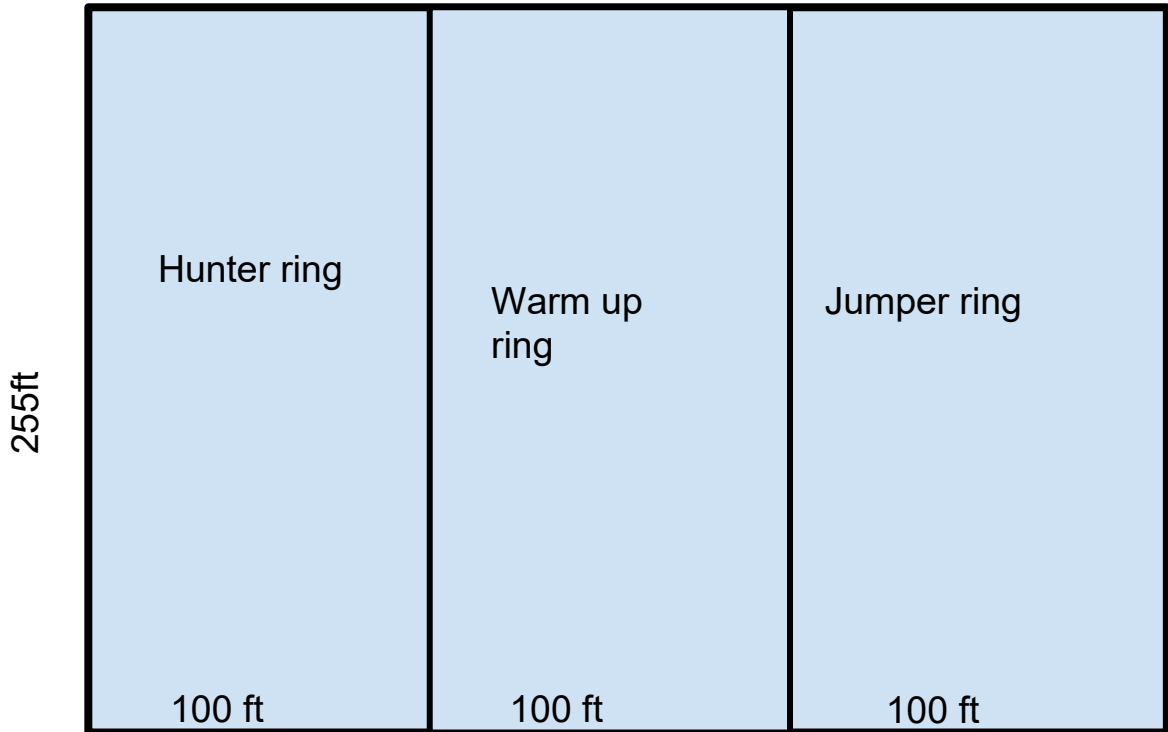
ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING OR VAPING IN ANY BUILDINGS.

Open to horses or ponies and riders in their first two years of showing

Pony Hunter Under saddle class - US2- For ponies with junior riders

Junior Hunter Under saddle class - US3 - For riders 17 and under

Senior Hunter Under saddle class - US4 - For riders 18 and over

YOUNG HORSE CLASSES

Combined Young Horse US Class - YH3

Horses enter the ring at a walk and to be shown at a walk trot and canter in both directions. Horses will not be asked to gallop but will be asked to lengthen stride at trot. Horses will be judged on impulsion, balance, rideability and presence. Whips including dressage whips are allowed. Ribbons to 6th.

Combined Young Horse Hunter Class -YH2

3 years to jump 2'0

4 years to jump 2'6

5 years to jump 2'9

To be judged on performance, manners, way of going and hunting soundness. Ribbons to 6th.

Combined Young horse Confirmation Class YH1

HORSES MUST TROT IN HAND. Registered 3, 4, 5-year-old Canadian bred, foaled in Canada, suitable to become a sport horse – defined as a horse that is capable of excelling in the hunter, jumper, dressage or eventing disciplines. Will be judged 50% for movement and 50% for conformation/type. Horses will enter the ring at the walk, trot on the rail, and be lined up by the ringmaster. The handler should be in suitable riding attire. Horses shown in bridle. No whip person allowed. Ribbons to 6th.

Combined Young Horse Jumper class YH4

HORSES MUST TROT IN HAND. Registered 3, 4, 5-year-old Canadian bred, foaled in Canada, suitable to become a sport horse – defined as a horse that is capable of excelling in the hunter, jumper, dressage or eventing disciplines. Will be judged 50% for movement and 50% for conformation/type. Horses will enter the ring at the walk, trot on the rail, and be lined up by the ringmaster. The handler should be in suitable riding attire. Horses shown in bridle. No whip person allowed. Ribbons to 6th.

YH confirmation -yearlings and 2 year olds

HORSES MUST TROT IN HAND. Registered 1- & 2-year-old Canadian bred, foaled in Canada, suitable to become a sport horse – defined as a horse that is capable of excelling in the hunter, jumper, dressage or eventing disciplines. Will be judged 50% for movement and 50% for conformation/type. Horses will enter the ring at the walk, trot on the rail, and be lined up by the ringmaster. The handler should be in suitable riding attire. Horses shown in bridle. No whip person allowed. Ribbons to 6th.

Lead line - class - LL1

Open to junior riders, no cross entry to other classes

Walk trot equitation - Class - WT1

Open to junior riders. Riders may not enter flat classes that require canter but may enter beginner class over fences Ribbons to 6th

Beginner Horse walk - trot class WT2

Open to horses or ponies in their first year of showing as of January 1 2026. Ribbons to 6th.

Open Road Hack Classes - ORH1

OPEN TO HORSES ONLY Horses entered in this Division MUST conform to the type and characteristics of a Road Hack Animal as defined in the E.C. Rule Book, G1302. Open to horses over 14.2 hands, stallion, mare or gelding. Horses enter the ring at a walk. To be shown on a flat-footed walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Only 8 horses to hand

gallop at one time. To be judged on 55% performance, 20% substance, 15% conformation and 10% manners. Horses will be required to strip for conformation in the stake class, please have grooms available. Ribbons to 6th.

Saddle Pony class SP1

Open to ponies only. Ponies enter the ring at a walk. To be shown at a flat-footed walk with a reasonably loose rein, trot, and easy canter. To be judged on performance, conformation and manners. Ribbons to 6th.

Renaissance horse / pony division! - Classes - RH1, RH2, & RH3 - \$30 entry fee

This division consists of a road hack class, hunter class at 2'3 and a jumper class at 0.65m. Open to all riders and horses/ponies

Hunt and Go

To be eligible horses/ponies must have shown in at least one hunter division. Competitors must compete at the highest height they have shown at or higher.

Horse/rider combinations to jump a Classic round consisting of 5-6 fences. Directly after the completion of the Classic round, horses will pick up their pace and pass through a set of markers to begin the Handy portion of the class. The Handy round will consist of 4-5 fences, where pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. Option fences may be used in either round, at course designer's discretion. Two scores will be given by the judging panel, with one score for the Classic round, and one score for the Handy round. The scores will be added together to determine the total score and placement. In the case of a tie, the Handy score will be designated as the tie breaker. Formal attire is requested but not required. The jog will be mounted for soundness.

Each rider will find a team member to compete with, the other member will be driving a golf cart, they must have a driver's license or learners (must have a driver with them) to compete.

The combined time of the team will decide who the winner is. We ask that no one will get too crazy with the golf cart as we don't want to have any accidents or damages. Drivers will be required to sign a waiver.
